NOTICE OF DOPING CONTROL

Athletes and coaches must be aware that doping control tests may be conducted by the Canadian Centre for Ethics in Sport (CCES) on a random basis in accordance with the Canadian Anti-Doping Program.

ELIGIBILITY /LICENSES

To enter in the FIS COC event, a skier must:

- Be a member in good standing of their national federation.
- Have a valid Nordiq Canada racing and valid FIS PN license, OR foreign athletes must have a valid FIS PN license or a Nordiq Canada Associate Race License.
- Sign the Nordiq Canada Informed Consent Assumption of Risk form (through zone4 registration).
- Be internationally classified.
 - o Sanctioned race entry requires international classification status and assigned sport class.
 - o To obtain FIS PN Points, a skier must have a FIS PN license and be internationally classified.

Athletes with National Classification may enter the non-sanctioned category and sport class.

To participate in the non-sanctioned category, a skier must:

- Be a member of good standing of their national federation.
- Have a valid Nordiq Canada racing license.
- Sign the Nordiq Canada Informed Consent Assumption of Risk form (through Z4 registration)
- Be nationally classified OR not classified.
 - Athletes in this category will not obtain FIS points.

GUIDE LICENSES

Licenses for Para-Nordic guides are the responsibility of the visually impaired athlete. Although guides do not pay registration fees, they must register on Zone4 and must hold a valid Nordig Canada license.

The Guide for a Para-Nordic Visually Impaired athlete need not be a member of the same club.

REGISTRATION

Registration closes November 18th, in Zone4: All registration fees must be paid online on Zone4.

Race Fees: Cross Country Race fees are CDN \$50 per race. Individuals registering after November 18, 2024, forfeit their right to seeding. Such individuals will be assigned zero points and be seeded accordingly.

Trail fees are in effect for all official training and race days. Passes can be purchased at the Canmore Nordic Center.

Sales Taxes: Taxes and processing fees will be added to the race fees.

Refund: Refunds may be made at the sole discretion of Nordiq Canada. There will not be any refunds if athletes fail DNS races.

Corrections: Racers and coaches should consult the confirmation list on Zone 4 as soon as possible after they complete their registration. If there are any corrections to be made to your registration, please contact the competition secretary before November 18th.

SEEDING

The starting positions of the Para-Nordic racers will be determined by random draw.

Seeding distance lists will be distributed prior to each TCM for review by the coaches. Please contact igyapay@nordigcanada.ca before 15:00 prior to the TCM, should any corrections be required.

TEAM CAPTAINS' MEETINGS

The Team Captains' Meetings will be held via zoom, as per the Event Schedule.

Other communications with coaches will be done by WhatsApp and email.

BIBS

Bib pick-up will take place at the Nordiq Canada office. Bibs will be available for pick up at 8:30 a.m. Bibs will be sorted by Team or Club as identified during registration. Coaches and Staff please use FIS PN issued team bibs.

Athletes will be charged a bib replacement fee of \$100 for each missing bib, which must be paid prior to another race start being granted.

WAXING

The use of fluorinated wax or tuning products containing fluorine is not allowed for all categories. Standardized wax procedure will be in place. Nordiq Canada Para Nordic Ski Team Head Technician will test and communicate the wax standard to the teams on the WhatsApp group.

WARM UP

As it is an early season race, there is a strong probability that the trail network used for the race will be the only fully snow-covered trails, with limited snow in other areas of the facility. The priority will be to prepare the best possible race trails and snow coverage of warm-up and ski testing areas might be limited. More details will be available at the Team Captains Meetings; however, athletes and coaches should be prepared to use rock skis and/or prepare for running warm-ups and spinners.

Under normal conditions, the courses will be closed as follows before the races:

Racers can warm-up on the racecourse until 10 minutes before the start. The racecourse will then be closed until the end of the race. Please bring your running shoes and spinners to warm up in case of low coverage of snow and when the racecourse is closed.

All athletes on course should wear their race bibs. Bibs must be visible to officials. Skiers must ski in the direction of the racecourse when warming up. Skiers who do not respect the warm-up guidelines will be sanctioned. The Jury reserves the right to limit or restrict use of the racecourse if conditions warrant.

If available, the warm-up trails and the ski testing area will be groomed and prepared in the same manner and at the same time as the competition course to simulate race conditions.

COURSE AND STADIUM MAPS

Courses and stadium maps will be available November 1st at the latest.

RESULTS AND PROTESTS

The official timing will be done by Zone4 timing.

Unofficial and official results will be posted on the WhatsApp group. Protests must be submitted in accordance with ICR rules. A notification will be sent on the coaches What's app group to indicate that unofficial results can be consulted. The protest period will end 15 minutes after the notification is sent.

AWARDS

Awards will take place at the Bill Warren Training Center, 30min after the last racer finishes.

C. FACILITY INFORMATION

PARKING

There is limited accessible parking at the centre. Parking in the lower parking lot, by the Biathlon Building, is the closest. Nordic Center parking requires Kananaskis Parking Passes.


TRAIL FEES


