2025 FISU WORLD UNIVERSITY GAMES

Congratulations to the following athletes who have been selected to the 2025 FISU World University Games in Turin, Italy from January 8 to January 24, 2025. Athlete selections were based on the 2025 FISU World University Games Selection Criteria.

As outlined in the selection criteria (point 3.1), to be eligible and considered for selection, athletes had to have registered an Expression of Interest (EOI) either through Zone4 portal or with Julie Beaulieu by November 13, 2024, to be considered for selection.

A \$250 appeal fee must be paid to Nordiq Canada before an appeal can be reviewed. It is recommended athletes contact the selection authority (listed before) prior to submitting an appeal as issues can often be resolved outside the appeal process.
