2. Nordiq Canada Selection of COC Leaders

Subject to section 4.0 in [Rules for the FIS Cross-Country Continental Cup](#), Nordiq Canada may select athletes to use the additional quota provided by FIS based on the following:

Nordiq Canada will only offer team and travel support to COC leaders at WC races outlined in the 2026-2027 Competition Selection Criteria.

3. Series Scoring

1. The World Cup Scoring system defined in Appendix A will be used to determine the overall leaders throughout the COC Series.
2. Athletes who do not hold a valid Canadian FIS race License will be included when assigning points in an individual race
3. Athletes who do not hold a valid Canadian passport, a valid Nordiq Canada race license, and a valid Canadian FIS license will not be included in the overall series leaders list
4. The principles to be applied for any tie-breaking situations is outlined in [the FIS World Continental Cup rules](#).

1. Cancellation, change of format, or relocation of any race in the series will result in a review of the number of results to be considered in each period; this reassessment will be made by the High-Performance Director (HPD).

4. General Information

2. FIS Objectives: To assist athlete development for participation in the World Cup (WC).
3. Nordiq Canada Objectives: To create competitive opportunities based on results from select domestic competitions to provide WC starts and stimulate the transition from domestic to future WC, World Ski Championships and Olympic Winter Games medalists.
4. These additional quotas are nominative; athletes cannot be substituted if they decline or are unable to start.
5. The athletes have to meet the World Cup entry requirements (see [FIS World Cup Rules](#) point 2.1).
6. General principles about qualification for the WC can be found in the WC rules (see [FIS World Cup Rules](#)).
7. Competitors with FIS licenses, entered in the open classes of individual races, will be eligible for points allocated for the series standings and 2026-2027 series winners.
8. All FIS requirements regarding additional quota for the COC Series leaders and winners are in the rules for the [FIS Cross-Country Continental Cup](#).
9. Nordiq Canada's HPD reserves the right to decide whether Canada will utilize these additional WC quota positions allocated by FIS in consideration of Canada's FIS Continental Cup Series.

10. Nordiq Canada will only consider for selection members in good standing who have a valid Canadian passport, a valid Nordiq Canada license, and a valid FIS license and who meet FIS minimum eligibility standards.
11. The COC series winners will receive travel subsidies according to the [FIS World Cup rules](#).
12. Selection decisions may be appealed under the Nordiq Canada Dispute Resolution and Appeals Policy.
13. Any dispute must be brought directly to the SDRCC to be heard pursuant to the Canadian Sport Dispute Resolution Code.
14. An athlete who wishes to appeal shall file an appeal with the SDRCC within 72 hours of the nomination Synopsis and Rationale being posted to the Nordiq Canada website.
